We had an exciting finish to the school year with our June 5 Fiesta Salad, where we celebrate growing our own food by making a fabulous salad for the whole school from a variety of red and green lettuces planted by students and neighbors as part of our LAWNS 2 **LETTUCE 4 LUNCH** project. It took about 12 hours over various days to wash, spin dry and bag our crop. The day before we chopped twelve other healthy ingredients to add as salad "toppings" to prepare for the school-wide Salad-bration.
