Help Needed for Neighborhood Conservation Plan

This month, volunteers will deliver to every home in the BMCA area a survey designed to collect information that we will use to write a Neighborhood Conservation Plan (NCP). Completing a NCP will qualify our civic association to apply for County funds to be used for neighborhood maintenance and improvement projects.

In 2002, Arlington voters approved a bond issue worth up to \$9 million for projects proposed by civic associations through the Neighborhood Conservation program. There are currently more than 70 projects active around the county, with over 50 more already proposed. These are diverse projects, ranging from installation of neighborhood signs to \$250,000 street improvement programs. Since 1988, the County has spent more than \$21 million for Neighborhood Conservation projects.

Please help us to earn our share of these bond-financed funds. After you receive the NCP survey please complete it and return it to one of the neighborhood volunteers identified in the instructions. Health Screening Available

Neighbors are urged to take this opportunity to detect warning signs of vascular disease. PREREGISTRATION IS REQUIRED; call 1-800-407-4557. Life Line, a leading provider of health screening services, will perform Carotid Vascular Tests, Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm Tests, and Peripheral Arterial Disease Tests to provide early detection of conditions that lead to stroke or other vascular disease. Each test is \$45, or you can take all three for \$99. Also available is Bone Density Screening to detect osteoporosis, for \$35.

Traffic Calming Progress Continues

Efforts to reduce driving speeds on our neighborhood streets have entered their fifth year and we can point to some continuing accomplishments. Pavement markings on the northern segment on N. Manchester St. presage the construction of the next phase of planned traffic calming measures. These will include improvements to the pedestrian island at Wilson Blvd., a curb extension to reduce the distance for pedestrians crossing Manchester at 8th Road N., and curb extensions to slow turning traffic at the intersection with 4th Road N. Construction will begin soon.

In October, the County offered to begin a new traffic calming project on N. Livingston St. between Wilson Blvd. and N. Madison St. This opportunity came much earlier than expected thanks to a new County effort the increase the number of traffic calming projects each year. Under this program, only speed humps or speed cushions are available; more complex measures, such as raised crosswalks or traffic circles, are not considered.

The proposed traffic calming plan calls for installation along Livingston of four speed cushions to encourage

drivers to observe the 25 mph posted speed limit. In December, a petition in support of the plan was signed by neighbors representing 73 percent of all homes within the affected area defined for the project, surpassing the 60 percent threshold needed to obtain funding. The Arlington Community Church, Rainbow Road Preschool, Upton Hill Regional Park, and BMCA also voiced support for the proposed plan.

In their January meeting, the Neighborhood Traffic Calming Committee voted to recommend the Livingston St. project to the County Board. It is anticipated that the Board will consider the project for funding at their February 21 meeting. You can check the agenda at http://www.co.arlington.va.us/cbo/meetings/index.htm.
