

Reevesland Historic Marker Installed

On June 18, 2005, the Historical Affairs and Landmark Review Board (HALRB) erected a tall steel marker engraved with a description of the County's newest historic district: Reevesland. The marker summarizes the 134-year history of Arlington's last operating dairy farm and the family who lived in the farmhouse at 400 N. Manchester St. until 2000.

The unveiling of the historic marker was marked by speeches from HALRB Chairman Kevin Vincent, BMCA President Larry Goldschmidt, and County Board members Chris Zimmerman and Paul Ferguson. More than 50 neighbors and other interested folk joined members of the Reeves family to celebrate the occasion.

The Reevesland historic marker is located in Bluemont Park, beside the trail on the west
