Virginia High Court Expands Tree Owners' Liability

In September, the Virginia Supreme Court issued a ruling that may have far-reaching effects for neighborhoods like Boulevard Manor that encompass many large, mature trees. Reversing a 1939 court decision, the ruling states that the owner of a tree "may be held responsible for harm caused to [adjoining property], and may also be required to cut back the encroaching branches or roots, assuming the encroaching vegetation constitutes a nuisance."

Reminder: Special Trash Pickups

Neighbors are reminded that Arlington County offers special pickup services for various types of refuse that cannot fit conveniently in your trash cart. You must request special pickups by calling the Solid Waste Division at 703-228-6570 or by using the online form at http://www.arlingtonva.us/EnvironmentalServices/login.aspx. If you do not make a request, special items left at the curb will not be collected. Special pickups include:

- Bulk metal: appliances, air conditioners, cabinets, exercise equipment, etc., weighing more than 50 pounds.
 The pickup fee is \$20 for the first item, \$10 for each additional item charged to your utility bill. Bulk metal is picked up on alternating Thursdays in BMCA.
- Unbundled brush: branches and logs less than 18 inches in diameter and less than 10 feet long. Brush is picked up on alternating Thursdays in BMCA.
- Yard Wastes: Leaves left curbside are collected by vacuum truck at least twice each autumn. The county also offers biodegradable bags which are collected on Fridays in BMCA during November and December and also during the spring. The county web site lists locations where bags will be available after October 22. The closest location to BMCA is the Lubber Run Recreation Center at the corner of N. Park Drive and George Mason Drive.

Native Trees Available at No Cost

Project Acorn is a fall giveaway of approximately 750 Jamestown Cherrybark Oak trees to enhance Arlington's environment and to celebrate the founding of Jamestown. The acorns were collected from the Jamestown historic site and grown out to tree seedling height by the Virginia Department of Forestry. These trees are intended for planting primarily on private residential properties or school yards. <u>If interested in a tree</u>, contact Phil Klingelhofer (703-524-5438 or phil@ceednet.org) with your name, contact information, and address by noon on October 24. The trees will be delivered to his home and ready for pickup soon after November 2.

Cherrybark Oaks do well in full sun to full shade and in moderate to moist soil. Before you request a tree, make sure you have a location with moderate to moist soil and sufficient room. The oaks may grow to over 100 feet tall and 3-5 feet wide, so you must avoid planting them under overhead power lines or too close to your home.
