Neighborhood Conservation Plan (NCP) Gains First Commission Approval

On May 15, the Neighborhood Conservation Advisory Commission approved Boulevard Manor's NCP. The unanimous vote followed a presentation of the plan's highlights by Matt Doyle, BMCA's representative to the commission.

In June, the NCP will be presented to the Planning Commission and, after they approve it, to the County Board. Once the NCP is approved by the County Board, it will be published and BMCA will become eligible for neighborhood conservation project funding.

Focus on Children, Youth and Families at BMCA General Meeting

The June 8 BMCA meeting will feature a speaker from the Arlington Partnership for Children, Youth and Families. Mary Ann Moran will discuss ways to use our neighborhood's strengths and resources to connect with and support young people in the neighborhood. Since 2001, the Partnership has surveyed thousands of Arlington middle and high school teens. The research revealed that only 40 percent of Arlington teens report living in a "caring neighborhood" and only 23 percent say they are valued in their community. There are many simple, but powerful actions neighbors can take to change teen perceptions. Learn more about ways you can make a positive difference for young people in Boulevard Manor.

4th Road N. Traffic Calming Proposal Moves Ahead

In 2008, the County Department of Public Works (DPW) determined that 4th Road N. between N. Manchester Street and N. Montague St. is eligible for traffic calming funds. Under the County's established neighborhood traffic calming (NTC) process, residents of the affected area worked with DPW to develop a plan for traffic calming measures. After 100 percent of the affected residents on 4th Road N. and the 400 block of N. Manchester Street signed a petition in support of the proposed plan, the BMCA Board endorsed the plan.

On March 23, 2009, the Arlington NTC Commission unanimously approved the project. The County Board is expected to consider the \$70,000 in July. If the Board approves the funding, construction will be scheduled for spring 2010.
