First BMCA Neighborhood Conservation Project Approaches Final Approval

BMCA's first project to complete the county's Neighborhood Conservation review and approval process is the Montague Street Beautification and Street Improvement project. The County Board has approved the budget for the project, which is tentatively scheduled to break ground in late July 2011.

Neighbors within the affected area will have an opportunity to review the 100% design for the project and to vote on whether to proceed with construction. The date for this meeting will be announced soon. After the meeting, the county will send postcards to the affected neighbors to solicit their votes.

The Montague Street Beautification and Street Improvement project will include:

- Installation of Carlisle street lights on the east side of Montague St. from Nottingham St. to 4th St. The new street lights will used LED bulbs that can tie to Arlington's planned "smart energy grid," which will allow dimming to save energy at off hours.
- Curb nubs at the intersections of Montague with 3rd St. and 4th St. to reduce motorists' speed as they turn.
- One speed hump near the intersection of Montague and 1st St.
- $_{_{\rm J}}$ Two raised crosswalks across Montague St. at the $3^{\rm rd}$ St. and $4^{\rm th}$ St. intersections.
- , A "Gateway treatment" or non-raised brick crosswalk at the entrance to the neighborhood (intersection of Manchester St. and Arlington Boulevard).

land. The former Reeves home will be the subject of a new assessment to be conducted this summer by historic architecture consultant John Milner Associates. Milner has been contracted to identify specific actions that should be undertaken to preserve the structural integrity of the house.

Neighborhood Celebrates New Bluemont Park Playground

On Neighborhood Day (May 21), Arlington County and BMCA co-sponsored a ribbon cutting event for the Bluemont Park playground constructed last winter. The playground had recently received an important finishing touch: installation of a low-rise steel fence along the bike path. The County used this event as the milestone for formally opening the facility.

State Delegate Robert Brink attended the event, which included remarks by County Board Member Walter Tejada and Dinesh Tiwari, Arlington's Director of Parks, Recreation, and Cultural Resources. Both speakers recognized BMCA community members who parti-

cipated in the planning process for the new playground. They specifically praised the productive, collaborative relationship between the County and the civic association.

The new playground features a large play structure designed to look like a locomotive and a farm-themed tot area. This equipment was inspired by the community's suggestion that the playground design evoke two historic neighborhood icons: Bluemont Junction and the former Reeves farm.

At the conclusion of formalities, children were invited to join in the ribbon cutting. The event ended, naturally, with rigorous play.

Spring at the New Reevesland Learning Garden

For Ashlawn students and teachers, it's been a spring of discovery and wonder at the new Reevesland Learning Garden where children are, in fact, learning about growing and eating healthy foods.

Six of the eight raised growing beds that were built by Boulevard Manor volunteers on the historic Reevesland property are assigned to Ashlawn grade levels Kindergarten through 5th. Another bed will be used by Kenmore Girl Scout Troop #2667, and one is the ceremonial first planting and demonstration bed.

Our neighbor Molly Stevens, whose backyard is steps away from the Learning Garden, and her delightful day-care children—five inquisitive 2-year olds—have been busy planting peas and spinach in a section of the Kindergarten bed.

The first and second grade Ashlawn ESOL (English as a Second Language) students planted lima beans which they had sprouted in the classroom. You'll see them in the 2nd grade garden along with marigolds, nasturtiums, and sunflowers.

Ashlawn science aide Alison Sheahan has accompanied many classes to the Reevesland Learning Garden to discuss Natural Resources of Virginia. The Learning Garden adds a new dimension to her annual tour of Reevesland and Bluemont Park. She can now point out the decades-old grape vines that were discovered still growing near the Learning Garden by the Reeves family children – Cheryl, Marcia and Ron – when they helped launch the Learning Garden in April.

Ashlawn teacher Vicki Paris's 4th graders have planted onions and lettuce while using their Reevesland visit for language arts exploration and measuring skills. And Jennifer Fitzpatrick's 5th graders have done soil tests and are working to improve the soil in their bed so that next year's fifth graders will be off to a good start with their planting.

There never seems to be enough time to spend in the Learning Garden, partly because when you're learning and having fun, time seems to fly by. As one 5th grade boy commented as he put his shovel down to head back to Ashlawn: "This gardening is addictive. I love it."

The Reevesland Learning Garden is a wonderful place to test your scientific hypotheses, observe plant cycles, and have fun exploring the wonders of nature. Please stop by as we grow and change with the seasons—and, most importantly, learn together.
