Earth Day Stream Cleanup

For Earth Day 2014, BMCA organized a community cleanup of Reeves Run, the spring-fed stream that originates in Upton Hill Park and flows into Four Mile Run. The stream runs behind the Arlington Community Church, Powhatan Springs Park, and across the DHARA pool property before entering a culvert beneath the Ashlawn school grounds and Bluemont Park.

Also involved in the April 19 cleanup were the Arlington Regional Master Naturalists and Arlington County's Invasive Species staff. The naturalists report that the wooded area of Reeves Run is home to diverse native species, but has become overgrown with invasives and affected by years of litter. With some hard work, the stream basin could be restored to its natural condition.

During the cleanup, BMCA neighbors filled trash bags with an assortment of garbage, some decades old. They also helped to remove invasive honeysuckle bushes and to pull non-native climbing vines from trees.

BMCA plans to continue cooperating with the Master Naturalists and the County to remove invasive species and trash. Refuse still to be removed includes abandoned household appliances and construction debris. Please watch for announcements of future cleanup events at www.boulevardmanor.org or on the BMCA listsery.
